- 1) One way people have tried to save the Chesapeake Bay is by creating the Chesapeake Bay Foundation to educate people about the environment.
- 2) Niagara Falls is located between Lake Erie and Lake Ontario.
- 3) Rain and snow wash polluted soil into the rivers that drain into the Chesapeake Bay.
- 4) Niagara Falls is important to the Northeast because of the electric power it produces and for the visiting tourists.
- 5) Some factories dump waste onto the land around the Chesapeake Bay, polluting the soil.
- 6) Hydropower plants on the Niagara River produce hydroelectricity.
- 7) The people who fish on the Chesapeake Bay are called watermen.
- 8) The White, Green, and Catskill Mountains are smaller ranges that make up the Appalachian Mountains.
- 9) Many families in the Chesapeake Bay area make a living by harvesting the sea.
- 10) New Jersey, Delaware, and Maine have the Atlantic Ocean as a border.
- 11) It takes many hours to make maple syrup because about 40 gallons of sap are needed to produce one gallon of syrup.
- 12) The largest of the Finger Lakes is Lake Seneca.
- 13) Key steps in maple syrup production are drilling holes in trees, collecting sap in large barrels, and then boiling the water out until pure syrup remains.
- 14) Warm air surrounding the Finger Lakes creates the right conditions for the grapes long growing season.
- 15) Water protects cranberry plants in the winter and spring. In the fall, air in the cranberries causes the berries to rise to the surface of flooded bogs to be harvested.
